Lab results

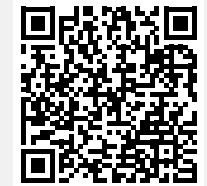
The toolkit is accessible online in English and Spanish.

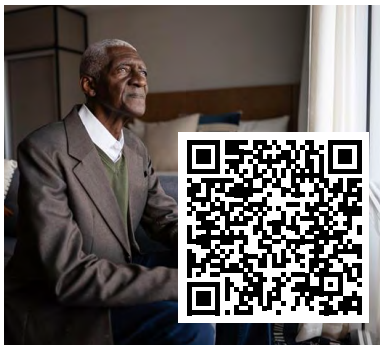
Access to Clinical Trials and Support
